



Nail changes

Nail Plate Abnormality

Koilonychia (spooning)
→ Iron Deficiency Anemia

Beau's lines (horizontal grooves)
→ Systemic dx transiently halting nail growth (i.e. malnutrition, shock)

Pitting
→ Psoriasis
→ Alopecia Areata

Hyperkeratosis (thickening)
→ Onychomycosis
→ Onychogryphosis

Onycholysis
→ Onychomycosis
→ Psoriasis
→ Hyperthyroidism

Fungi
→ If white/yellow-brown:
Onychomycosis
→ If green:
Pseudomonas

Brown/black linear streak
→ Melanocytic nevus
→ Malignant melanoma
→ Drug-induced discoloration

Oil Drop sign
→ Psoriasis

Discoloration

Trachyonychia (Linear Ridging)
→ Alopecia Areata

Nail Bed Abnormality

Blue discoloration
→ Medications
→ Wilson's disease
→ Silver poisoning
→ Cyanosis

Red Discoloration (dark red, thin lines, painful)
→ Bacterial endocarditis
→ Trauma

Nail Fold Abnormality

Telangiectasia
→ SLE
→ Scleroderma
→ Dermatomyositis (DM)

Inflammation (erythema, swelling, pain)

Lateral Only
→ Ingrown nail

Lateral and Proximal
→ Acute paronychia
→ Chronic paronychia

Clubbing

Broncho-pulmonary dx
→ Chronic hypoxia
→ Bronchiectasis
→ Lung cancer
→ Asbestos
→ Cystic fibrosis

Cardio-vascular dx
→ Cyanotic heart disease

Gastro-intestinal dx
→ IBD
→ GI cancer

Endocrine dx
→ Hyperthyroidism (grave's disease)

Other
→ HIV
→ Congenital defect

Terry's Nails (proximal 90% white)
→ Liver cirrhosis
→ Congestive heart failure
→ Diabetes mellitus

Half & Half Nails
→ Chronic renal failure
→ Uremia

Muehrcke's lines (transverse lines)
→ Nephrotic Syndrome
